REMINDER:

If you are taking Warfarin tablet, please have your blood test done (INR) within a week prior to eye injection. If the result is more than 4, please ring Mr Lee's secretary on 01895 835144

There is no need to stop Aspirin or Clopidogrel

If you experience the side effects listed below,

DO NOT worry. These are very common and will disappear in few days time. Just continue using your eye drops.

- Mild eye pain for the first 24 hours Take paracetamol
- Apply Maxitrol ointment up to twice per day for one day only
- Blurry vision just after the injection your pupil often dilates afterwards due to the drops we put in
- Small floater, bubble or spot in the vision this is sterile air that is harmless and will dissolve in 24 hours. **IF** a floater, bubble or spot that increases in size, drop of vision, or severe pain at any time please contact us on 01895 835144
- Blood shot due to drops or small superficial bleeding at time of injection, this will go
- Eye sore, gritty sensation may last 24 hours
- Do not rub or touch your eye as easy to scratch the eye and have an abrasion as the eye is anaesthetised for an hour and this does not have its protective pain reflexes
